Shaping EUGLOH Career Network: Boosting Students' Career Development

Erasmus + Blended Intensive Programme (BIP)

Call of Interest





1. INTRODUCTION

In the framework of the European University Alliance for Global Health (EUGLOH), the EUGLOH Career Network has been established, within Work Package 4 "Career, Personal Development & Lifelong learning", with the goal of enhancing career services and promoting employability across all partner institutions. This network aims to create a collaborative framework where career professionals from the different EUGLOH partner Universities can share knowledge and best practices, develop innovative strategies, and support each other in stimulating student and graduate employability. The main goal is to create a platform for representatives from different Universities to come together, share ideas, and collectively work towards establishing a common basis for student career development that creates a multiplier effect and benefits all Universities and academic communities.

In an increasingly competitive job market full of uncertainty and challenges, the EUGLOH Career Network plays a critical role by:

- allowing interdisciplinary collaboration combining expertise from various interdisciplinary areas linked to Global Health fostering innovation and comprehensive solutions to societal challenges;
- enhancing employability (access to internships, job placements, and networking opportunities that reinforce students and graduates' employability and career prospects) and global perspective and providing an understanding of diverse cultural contexts of the labour market, sustainable careers, green jobs and companies;
- promoting international experiences and cross-cultural learning, preparing graduates to work effectively in diverse environments;
- allowing access to cutting-edge research, ensuring that students and graduates are connected to the latest developments and innovations, equipping them with the skills and knowledge needed to contribute effectively to the field;
- providing tailored career support and talent development opportunities to strengthen EUGLOH's role
 in training highly qualified HR prepared to solve societal challenges, with strong knowledge,
 competencies, values and attitudes, thus reinforcing EU HE's competitiveness, attractiveness and
 impact in employability, lifelong learning and responsible citizenship.

By addressing these aspects, the EUGLOH Career Network will be an important player for the better preparation of the next generation of professionals and ensuring that partner institutions can effectively contribute to and benefit from advancements in the career and labour market fields.

The upcoming workshop is a crucial step in this goal, as it will bring together stakeholders to collaboratively develop a common strategy and an actionable plan. By aligning our efforts and leveraging our collective expertise, we aim at building a robust support system that empowers students and graduates from the Alliance to succeed in the global job market.

2. OBJECTIVES

- Promote the alignment and enhancement of a EUGLOH Career Network through the identification of needs, expectations and common goals as well as defining and drawing up common strategies and the pillars of a Career Network
- Promote networking, exchange of knowledge, experiences and best practices in talent and career;





- Brainstorm and plan the effective organisation of the upcoming series of innovative virtual/hybrid career events;
- Understand potential synergies for the creation of a EUGLOH Career Network to better promote the students' career development journey within EUGLOH, with a particular focus on enhancing internship opportunities. By prioritizing the promotion of internships, we can facilitate hands-on learning experiences that are crucial for bridging the gap between academic knowledge and professional skills.
- Analise the potential of a EUGLOH Career Network and career services and the strengths from which
 to build and collaborate, by identifying the main challenges faced by HEI in career and employability
 issues and propose collaborative solutions.
- **Reinforce a EUGLOH Career Network**, facilitating the creation and strengthening of contact networks between career services and other professionals from EUGLOH member universities.
- Collaboratively design dynamic, agile, and flexible organisational and collaboration activities, events, and practices and define a common action plan for a EUGLOH Career Network, maximizing the existing resources that can result in joint initiatives and collaborative projects.

3. EXPECTED OUTCOMES

Create a support system by strengthening personal contacts and creating the implementation action plan

- 1. Create a EUGLOH Career Network strategy and a common cross-institutional support system:
 - a. Align the professionals and structures working on career development
 - b. Create synergies among career professionals of EUGLOH universities or other career related projects, which will include an overview of its strengths and needs.
 - c. Create of a knowledge base accessible to all professionals involved in the EUGLOH network.

2. Strengthen network of contacts:

- a. Good understanding of the organisation, structures, departments, and resources for career activities of every participating university.
- b. Create a more cohesive and active network of contacts between career professionals from EUGLOH member institutions, facilitating communication and ongoing collaboration.
- c. Establishment of regular communication channels for information exchange and mutual support.

3. Develop an Implementation Action Plan:

- a. Create an action plan for the EUGLOH Career Network that aligns with the goals and implementation of the tasks defined in the EUGLOH project plan (including for example virtual career events and the dissemination of internship opportunities), ensuring the integration of best practices and new initiatives within EUGLOH universities, while considering activities planned for 2025 and 2026
- b. Identify and Prioritize Key Initiatives: Identify and prioritize the initiatives and activities that are most urgent and impactful to be implemented, in line with the objectives of setting up a network of EUGLOH career/employability experts and promoting networking, experience exchange, and best practices.
- c. Create a Roadmap for Ongoing Monitoring: Establish a roadmap for the activities to be held in 2025/2026 and meetings to monitor and evaluate the progress of these initiatives, incorporating regular meetings, "staff training weeks," and other planned activities to assess needs and expectations through surveys, and to support the dissemination of placement opportunities within the EUGLOH framework.





4. PROFILES

Professionals working in career departments, professionals working in the careers of doctoral students/researchers; academics and researchers with projects in areas of talent and career development and management, development of personal and social skills and employability, labour market, from all EUGLOH member Universities. This workshop is also available for professionals working in other career related projects (incl. other EU funded projects).

"What do we want from the EUGLOH Career Network" | 30th October 2024 3pm 5pm CET (discussion about what is expected from the Career Network through breakout rooms and reflective exercises to gather insights, expectations, and ideas from participants about the desired features, services, and functionalities of the EUGLOH Career Network)
- 2. "Getting inspired from the experience of other Alliances and Q&A | 6th November 2024 3pm 5pm CET (through a round table, other European Alliances representatives will present what they have been working on related to employability and career issues and the importance of the topic within the scope of alliances for the working group to have inspiration and inputs





8. ONSITE COMPONENT

Following up on the discussions initiated in the online component, the in person part will be composed by collaborative workshops using design thinking, which are intended to focus on refining our strategic goals and implementation action plans for the EUGLOH Career Network, building on the synergies identified.
