
















MEDICINE



Wroclaw Medical University is one of the best medical universities in Poland with over 70 years of tradition. Our students can develop their skills in the biggest and most modern clinical base in the region, as well as in the Medical Simulation Centre equipped with interactive phantoms. Admission requirements:

No entrance exams. Admission based on the results from two subjects presented on the high school diploma:

- · biology (obligatory),
- · chemistry, physics or mathematics (one of them)

Subjects on the highest level

- points multiplied by 1,5

Subjects on the basic level

- points multiplied by 1

English language proficiency on the B2 level required







Medicine programme:

- · The English programme of medicine is adapted to the common European programme, in keeping with the European admission standards for medical education.
- · First two years are devoted to preclinical (theoretical) subjects such as: anatomy, histology, embryology, genetics, immunology, etc.
- Foreign students also take Polish language classes to be able to communicate with the patients from the third vear onwards.
- · From the third year students are taught clinical subjects such as pathology, pharmacology, microbiology, paediatrics, surgery, etc.
- · After completing six years of studies and meeting all the requirements depending on the country, the students will be able to apply for a medical license. The diploma is recognized in EU and EFTA countries, USA, Canada, India, Thailand and many others.
