

**INFORMATION CLAUSE CONCERNING PERSONAL DATA PROCESSING
OF STUDENTS DIRECTED TO INTERNSHIP,
IN RELATION TO THE DIAGNOSTICS FOR SARS-COV-2 VIRUS**

Pursuant to Art. 13 of the Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council (EU) 2016/679 of 27 April

2016 (general data protection regulation – GDPR) we would like to inform you that:

1. The Controller of your personal data is Wrocław Medical University (Uniwersytet Medyczny im. Piastów Śląskich we Wrocławiu), with its registered office at: Wybrzeże Pasteura 1, 50-367 Wrocław, hereinafter referred to as „Data Controller”, represented by the Rector.
2. The Data Controller has appointed a Data Protection Supervisor who can be contacted in relation to any issues concerning personal data processing, to the following e-mail address: iod@umed.wroc.pl
3. Your personal data will be processed for the following purposes:
 - a) resulting from the educational process, i.e. organisation of internship,
 - b) performing laboratory diagnostics for SARS-CoV-2 before the beginning of the obligatory internship.
4. The legal basis for the processing of your personal data is:
 - a) Art. 6 sec. 1 (c) of the GDPR, i.e. fulfilling the legal obligations imposed on the Data Controller resulting from the provisions of the Act of 20 July 2018. The Law on Higher Education and Science, and other provisions which the Data Controller is bound with;
 - b) Art. 6 sec. 1 (e) of the GDPR, i.e. the need for data processing in order to carry out the task performed in the public interest,
 - c) Art. 9 sec. 2 (g) of the GDPR, i.e. the need for data processing for reasons related to the public interest,
 - d) Art. 9 sec. 2 (i) of the GDPR, i.e. the need for processing for reasons related to the public interest in the field of public health, such as protection against serious cross-boarder health threats or ensuring high standards of quality and security of healthcare and medicinal products or medical devices.
5. Your personal data: name, surname, address, PESEL, telephone number will be made available by the Data Controller to the following entity performing diagnostics: University Clinical Hospital in Wrocław, ul. Borowska 213, 50-556 Wrocław.
6. The Data Controller will keep your personal data for the period of time necessary to achieve the purpose of processing, but not longer than for 30 days from the moment when the Data Controller receives the original test result from the entity performing the diagnostics. After this period, personal data will be deleted (destroyed).
7. In the cases, in accordance with the principles and under the procedure specified in the binding regulations, you have the right to: access the data and rectify them (Art. 15 and 16 of the GDPR), require deletion of data (Art. 17 of the GDPR), limit the processing (Art. 18 of the GDPR), object to the processing of personal data (Art. 21 of the GDPR), transfer the data (Art. 20 of the GDPR).
8. You have the right to lodge a complaint with a supervisory authority - the President of the Personal Data Protection Office - if it is suspected that the processing of personal data by the Controller infringes the provisions of law.
9. The obligation to provide your personal data results from the need to pass them on to the diagnostic entity. Failure to provide these data will prevent you from doing the professional training.
10. Your personal data are not subject to automated individual decision-making, including profiling, referred to in Art. 4 point 4 of the GDPR, which is a form of automated processing of personal data consisting in using personal data to evaluate certain personal aspects of an individual.
